Joe: Howdy Warden. Look how clean my cell is! That should clear up my record,

don't you think?

Announcer: Are you someone who doubts that God exists?

Carin: Frank, do you believe there's a God?

Frank: Oh, I don't know. Personally, I doubt it.

Announcer: The question of whether God exists is an important one. Don't base your beliefs

on your doubts. Turn your doubts into questions and start asking them. The Bible

has a lot to say about God. Be passionate about finding the answer.
